In Europe the QA system is evolving fast. Students involvement has improved in some cases, however students are mostly considered to be only useful for teaching and learning matters. Students are more than that; well trained a student expert can give valuable inputs on all institutional activities, including research, governance and administration, as well as service to society.

Having a big network with different students all over Europe we have realized, that most of our problems are shared obstacles. If we had a platform to exchange our experiences and approaches with each other we could improve our position in QA processes even more and raise the value and understanding of QA among a broader student population.
